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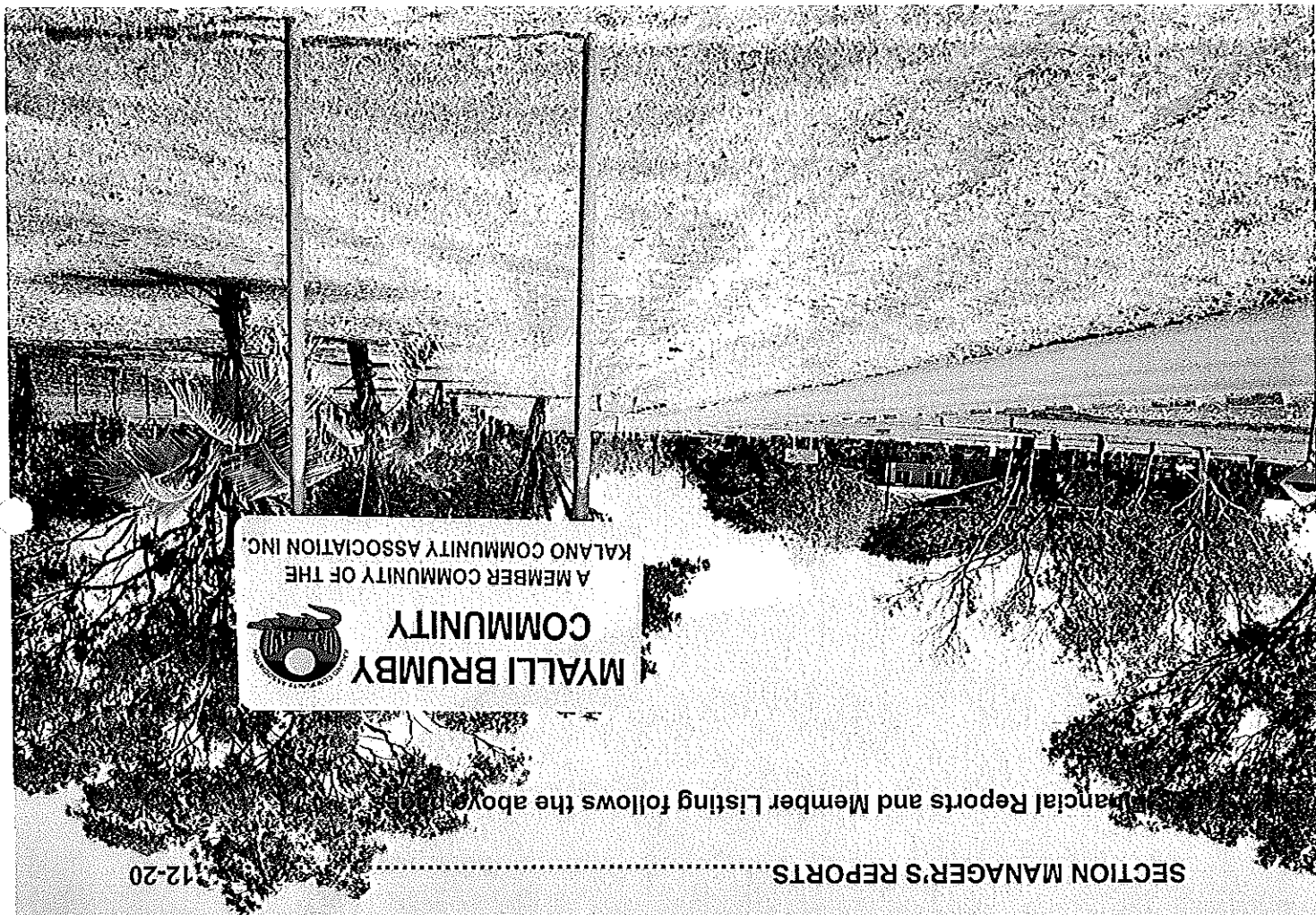
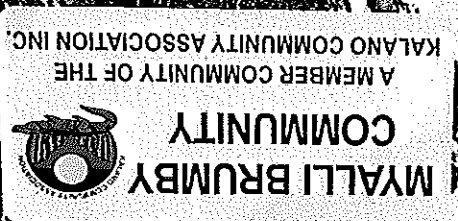
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INTRODUCTION

KALANO SERVICES

Kalano Community Association is a Community controlled Aboriginal Organisation providing a range of services to the communities of Myall, Brumbly, Binjari, Rockhole and Geyilkagan; as well as community members who reside in the Katherine Township. The offices are located on Kalano community which lies on the Northern side of the Katherine River. Our hours of operation are from 8 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Friday, every second week our office closes early Friday afternoon at 1:15 pm as part of an Enterprise Bargaining Agreement.

Essential Services - develops, manages and maintains an essential and municipal service program to the communities including rubbish removal and maintenance of grounds;

Kalano Housing - aims to maintain an effective and culturally appropriate rental housing program for Kalano members. The program also provides repairs and maintenance to housing and provides training for local Indigenous people.

Vendale Rehab - Provides an effective, culturally appropriate residential alcohol treatment program including support and counseling services to clients and their families in a quiet bush setting on Fox road 38 km South of Katherine.

HACC Program - Providing assistance and meals to the older generations of our communities ensuring regular meals and domestic assistance such as laundry, medical appointments and other day to day activities required to maintain healthy living.

Community Patrol - Operating an effective, culturally appropriate Patrol in the Katherine region extending to Binjari and Rockhole communities. Set up to work in conjunction with the Mt Police, Katherine Town Council, various Government Departments and other Indigenous Organisations. Kalano Community Patrol has grown in strength and reputation and is viewed as vital in addressing social behaviours in the wider community. Identify priorities and ensure families and sheltered clothed, fed and educated with the finances available.

GDEP - Is designed to assist people in attaining skills and experience to prepare them for full time meaningful employment. Money Management Services - this program is delivered to assist income managed individuals to understand the process of income management, to set household budgets, manage and reduce debt and plan for the future. Tools used to assist these processes are Bank and credit union products and services, internet and phone banking, Centrelink services (income management and basics card) and financial counselors.

INTRODUCTION

Vendale Transitional After Care - Provides an effective, culturally option for clients to access after treatment completion in a residential facility for Alcohol & Other Drugs. VTAC is currently also accessed as a pre-care facility that deals with the current demand and waiting list for Vendale Rehabilitation Centre.

Money Management - An effective and culturally appropriate approach to assisting our member community to handle and budget money.

Kalano Farm - The Kalano farm is currently growing and harvesting Tomatoes and Sweet Corn on site. This includes the sorting, packaging and transporting to Woolworths distributors in the Northern Territory. 2012 will see the introduction of Mushrooms to the mix.

Sport & Recreation - Kalano still holds a Sport and Recreation office and is currently appealing to government to further support this very under resourced service.

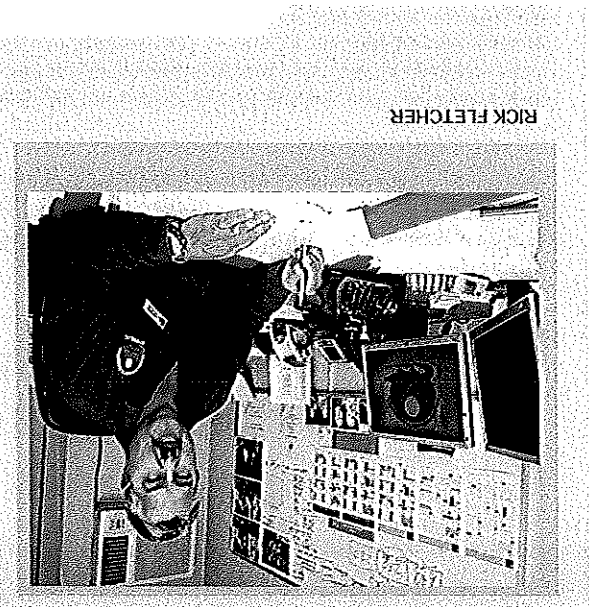
Finally, as always, let me finish my report by paying my respect and offering my sincere condolences to the families who have lost loved ones in our community this year.

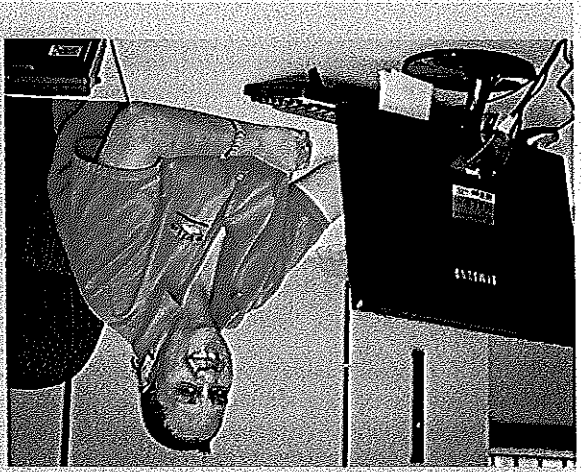

It has been a progressive year in the Essential Services Team this year, with:

- the purchase of a new tractor,
- purchase of new front-deck mower
- the upgrade of the Rockhole Sewerage system
- Survey of the drainage system – Myalll Brumby
- Tree removal
- Refurbishment of Mitsubishi Tipper and Canter.

Future projects include

- Cleaning of drains in the Myalll Brumby community
- Repair of drains – Myalll Brumby community
- Ground works on community park area – Rockhole
- New playground – Rockhole
- Laying of new irrigation areas – Rockhole & Geyulkgan
- Tree planting along roadside – Rockhole
- Tree planting in fenced off camping areas – Geyulkgan

A re-organisation of the crew now sees Dennis Arnold overseeing all crews and leading the Myalll Brumby team, with Albert O'Connor as the groundsman for the main office complex. Glen Nuglin is leading the Geyulkgan team, and James Palmer leads the Rockhole team.

With this new leadership team, we have experienced an overall increase in CDEF participation in these communities.

The members of the Essential Services Team should be very proud of their efforts, as it is believed that all communities look great and this an obvious testament to their hard work.

STAFF HAVE WORKED TOWARDS CREATING GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR PARTICIPANTS

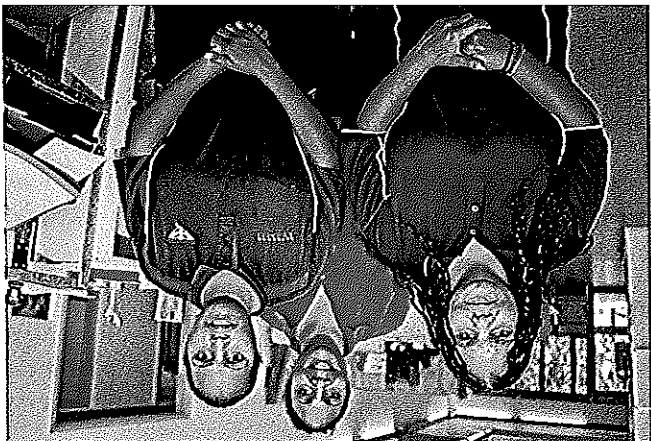
In March this year Rick has divided housing up into two I manage the Tenancy side of Housing and Steve Berryman manages the property side of housing since March for me it had been a big challenge learning new stuff and trying to get my head around the whole Tenancy programme managing the 15 houses in Town, 35 houses in Myall Brumby including the 5 HAAC Units, 21 houses at Rockhole and 9 houses at Geulkigan including 4 tin shed. Luckily I have Sonia Agale and Evelyn Andrews who are our Tenancy Officers Evelyn's on Maternity Leave at the moment and Andrea McDonald have replaced her until she is due back.

The rental and debt control is the hardest part of Tenancy Management trying to keep track of the rental payment. Since the new rental increase it has been very hard especially with getting tenants to pay the new rental increase plus their debts when they are experiencing financial difficulties but hopefully this will bring a good thing at the end as we are planning to have renovations in each of our Communities.

We have set up to have Housing Member Committee Meetings with each Community every second month presenting new housing applications, the waiting list, outstanding rental debts general maintenance and other housing issues.

Every two months we go out on the communities visiting tenants doing population surveys asking tenants the names, ages and income details of each person living in a household keeping up to date with our population and our tenant's information.

Once again this year has been very challenging managing 4 Communities including Town, 80 properties and providing a housing service to almost 450 people.

KALANO WISHES TO START ON A RENOVATION PROGRAM FOR ITS HOUSING STOCK

As most of you know the housing department has been split into 2 departments; Tenancy and Property. While the tenancy department continued on from the old department property started from scratch. It took some time to arrange all of this; finding office space, obtaining office furniture and computers and putting together a system that would benefit the workers and our clients. At the start we had to refine our procedures to enable a better work flow and we think that we now have things right.

As explained at community meetings this year Kalano wishes to start on a renovation program for its housing stock. To help enable this to happen the Indigenous Building team has been upgrading the caretaker's house at the old rehab unit at Rockhole. Once completed we hope to upgrade a house per month as well as do our normal maintenance work.

We also intend to build a meeting shed at Myall Brumbly similar to the one at Rockhole.

If any of you have the need for urgent work to be done on your house please contact Steven Berryman or talk to the ladies from tenancies when they visit your community.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the maintenance crew Nathan, Kenny, Michael, Phillip, Liam and all others that have spent time with us for their help in digging in and getting the job done.

- Fresh milk and juices

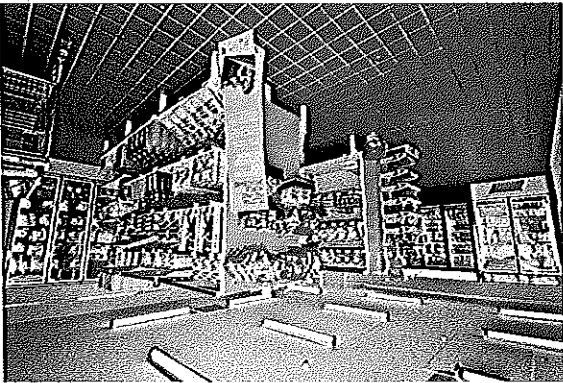

- Weekly specials and very competitive pricing

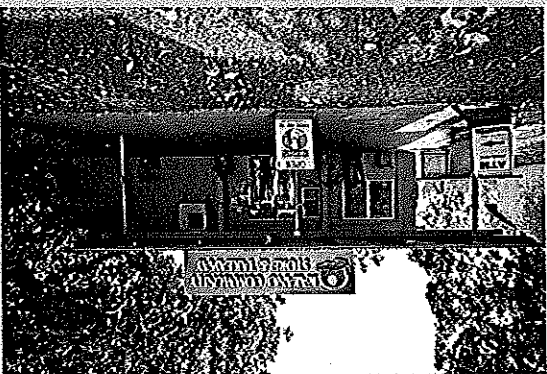
The Store also offers a Home Delivery service for customers with shopping too large to carry home!

ANOTHER YEAR OF HIGH QUALITY COMMUNITY PATROL SERVICE

Since the 2011 Annual General Meeting, Community Patrol has expanded from just 15 staff to 23 employees in total, providing a stable place of employment for many CDEF participants and has given those same participants a chance to be placed in full time employment.

In 2012 we witnessed the establishment of a Binjari office and 3 full time employees being placed in the community to monitor and engage with community members.

Patrol Officers now have an office located in Rockhole, which is now starting to be utilized.

Community Patrol has seen many changes with a new government coming into power in the Territory with their first action being to discontinue the Banned Drinkers Register (BDR). The effect of disbanding the BDR has in turn seen an increase in both local and community members consuming greater amounts of alcohol as well as more anti-social behaviour.

Since the election of the new Government, the Community Patrol continues to work tirelessly in many different types of weather, night and day to engage with individuals and families to ensure their safety is a top priority, to provide assistance when individuals are intoxicated or are in desperate need of transport back to a secure environment.

We look forward to another year of providing our member communities and the patrons of Katherine Community Patrol Service.

Kalano Community Patrol would like to thank Mission Australia - Sobering Up Shelter, NT Police Force and the Katherine District Hospital for their continued assistance in making sure members of the public are kept out of harm's way.

LEARNING FAST - ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SEASON

The farm had a busy wet season program, with participants undergoing

- Cert II in Horticulture,
- ChemCert Certificate,
- Freshcare Certificate,
- Forklift ticket,
- Tractor Ticket,
- refurbishment of 2x Essential Services Trucks
- Preparation of the ground for our growing season.

Thanks go out to Malcolm Bishop for the use of his tractor and plough for ground preparation and Laurence Christian for the use of his tractor, super spreader and sprayer. Thanks also to Patsy Flannery and the Woolworths team for their ongoing encouragement and support.

The farm performed well this growing season, with over 100 tonnes of tomatoes, capsicum and corn being produced. The season started off wet and made it difficult to start planting by the 1st of April, but the farm team prevailed in the muddy conditions to get the first seedlings in the ground.

The early plantings performed extremely well, with up to 9 tonne per week being produced before the cooler weather reduced yields.

Highlights of the year were the farm being featured on Gardening Australia. DVD's of this are available from Casey McElhone. Other highlights included Casey's Woolworths Agricultural Business Scholarship, display and articles at the Katharine Show and Marcus Raymond's interview on ABC Radio.

It is hoped that the team leaders will tour the Victorian and South Australian tomato growing areas in late November / early December. Programme for next season is already being developed to increase to a production level of 20 – 24 tonne of tomatoes per week. Corn and capsicum are also being looked at as part of next year's programme.

With the projected increased production next season there will be ample opportunity for anyone wishing to be involved in the horticulture venture to join the team. There will be a Cert III in Horticulture offered to anyone keen to expand their skill base.



BOTH FACILITIES ARE AT CAPACITY...

As of the date that this report was written, Venndale and VTAC were both at capacity. Referrals are only increasing at Venndale and thanks to the Northern Territory and Australian Government, Venndale and VTAC have been able to explore options for growth this year. New Construction at Venndale has included the 6 demountable, a new, 4 man unit built by the BITE Team, a new dining and laundry area, 6 new offices and an extension to the current group room to prepare Venndale for 40 clients as well as heading towards 60. Venndale is planning the expansion towards 60 clients and is hoping to involve training and reintegration as key outcomes of the program.

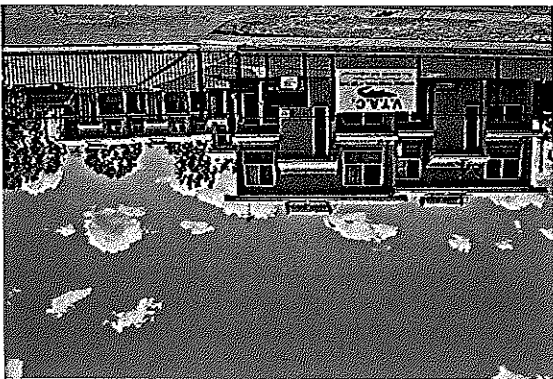
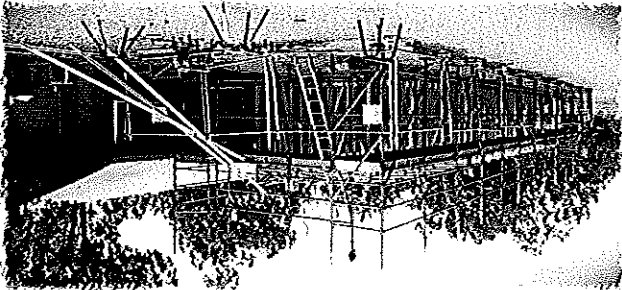
The staffs has been amazing at Venndale this year, Venndale is full and always will be full so there is very little need for me to include specific statistics on admission rates in this report. Instead, this year I'd like to dedicate and make my gratitude known to my staff out at Venndale. Gerry Hudson has been amazing as my right hand man and has helped keep Venndale on the tracks in my absence. We have 3 Case Managers who are fantastic as well as a Care Taker and range of Support staff who are also the BEST... This year would not have happened without them.

Venndale Participated in some major event this year that we are very proud to be involved in: The NAIDOC Match, Basketball at Banunga, Filming of Imparja TV Ads, Represented Venndale in several football carnivals, helped paint the Clyde Fenton and Binjar Pre-Schools and Graduated more than 20 participants in the Karen Sheldon training courses of which 3 of our clients have gained employment from the opportunity.

VTAC finally shined this year, it took a while for it to pick up but as we are using this to support the needs of clients who will not fit at Venndale it has enabled us to provide as service for these clients also. Our team is currently picking the VTAC clients up every morning and taking them to Venndale where those clients still participate in the relapse prevention courses that we run at Venndale. Once Venndale is staffed and resourced for 40 clients it will make this process almost seamless. It will also free up room for more people who still to be treated.

Lastly I'd like to thank Rick, April, Ashley and Maria also. They have all done a wonderful job at keeping us all inline. Rick's support is obviously the greatest asset to Venndale as we are so far from Kalano and he has done a fabulous job at supporting us this year. The finance team also have supported as very well this year, they have assisted us and catered for us on demand most times and your work has not gone unnoticed. Thanks

HACC REPORT

The Kalano home and community care (HACC) program is operated from the Women's Resource Centre building located in the grounds of the Administration Block. This program has been in operation for a number of years.

During the reporting period a long term employee of Kalano Community Association and Manager of HACC Mrs. Georgina Campbell left the employment of the Organisation. Jo contributed a number of years to the development of the HACC program and provided much needed personal care to a number of our clients. She is sadly missed.

In light of this change the program operates with 4 staff:

Linda Fletcher	-	Temporary Manager
Raymond Cadell	-	Personal Carer
Lisa Butler	-	Personal Carer
Mundy Cleary	-	Personal Carer

Lisa is a personal carer of the program and conducts her duties from the Kalano Community Aged Care facility which is currently operated by the Australian Red Cross. Ms Butler assists clients in the facility with their personal care which includes meals, bathing and laundry needs.

Raymond and Mundy are personal Carers and provide assistance to clients within the communities of Kalano and the township. The number of clients currently receiving the HACC services is 21. It is envisaged that during the next 6 months these numbers will be increased to meet some of the demand that currently exist within our community.

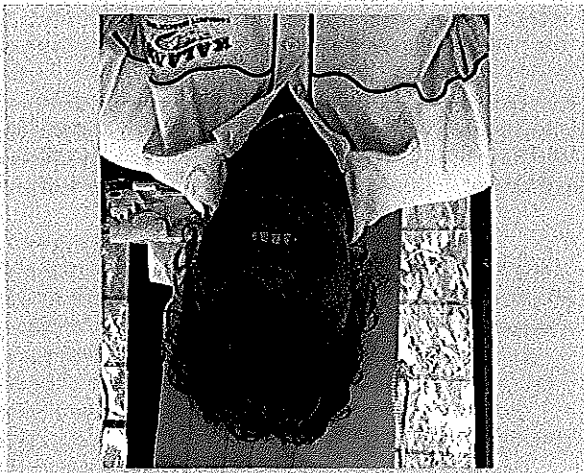
Prior to clients receiving a HACC service each person undergoes an assessment process. This assessment is vital to ascertaining the level of care/services required by the client, as in some cases the client may be too higher risk for the level of service that Kalano HACC provides.

The HACC program networks with other Aged and Disability services in Katherine to ensure that clients are not being missed.

Training and development of staff within the Organisation is ongoing and 3 staff members of the HACC program continued to study to complete a Certificate III in Home and Community Care through the Charles Darwin University (CDU). The study was undertaken in the workplace with CDU trainers travelling to Katherine on a number of occasions to conduct training. Two members of staff have completed this study. This certificate enables staff to have accredited training which is recognized and further develops the skills of workers in this field. Staff are to be congratulated for their hard work.

To provide emergency relief to assist people to deal with their immediate crises situation in a way that maintains dignity and encourages self-reliance.

Achievements for this financial year and any emerging issues

- Money Management section consists of a Manager, 2 full-time Money Management Workers and 1 x CDEP part-time Money Management Worker.
- Money Management delivers services to Myall Brumby, Rockhole, Binjart, Geyulkigan, Katherine Town and Barunga community in the Roper Gulf Shire area.
- Continued in the development of stronger working relationships with Kalano Housing, Health and Ageing, Essential Services, Finance and external Accountants to ensure that services are being provided and maintained.
- Very productive working relationship with Matrix on Board to provide training and staff development and general advice and support.
- Working relationship with other Money Management services, such as Mission Australia, Anglicare, Somerville, Catholic Care, and Roper Gulf Shire in particular Barunga community officers and Centrelink.
- Working alongside the Housing Tenancy Officers in the management of rental arrears for particular households and in the maintenance of services such as yard cleans, rubbish removal and the implementation of a bus service.
- 10 workshops have been delivered throughout our member communities including Barunga during this reporting period with a total number of 41 participants attending the workshops
- Staff members Linda Fletcher and Jacqueline Jackson graduated in the Certificate III in Community Services which is accredited training that can lead to further training in the future.
- In March 2012 staff attended an Emergency Relief Workshop in Darwin. This workshop enables staff to have a better understanding of the needs and how Kalano's money management program can best help our clients.
- In June two money management workers travelled to Alice Springs to attend a 3 day National Money Management workshop. The workshop was attended by all service providers from across Australia. This workshop enabled Kalano staff to identify best work practices and other options in the delivery of our money management program.

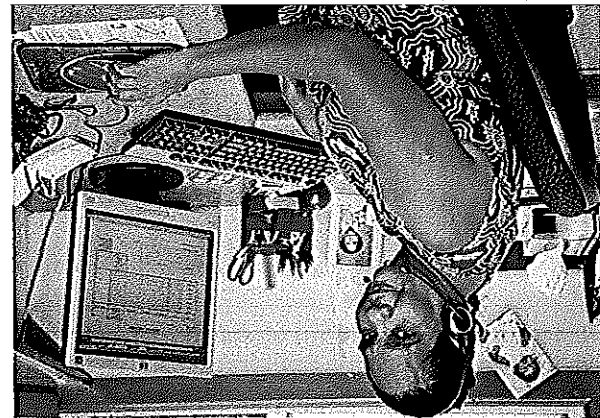
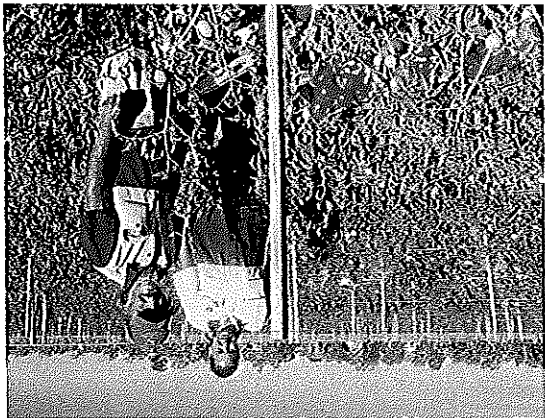
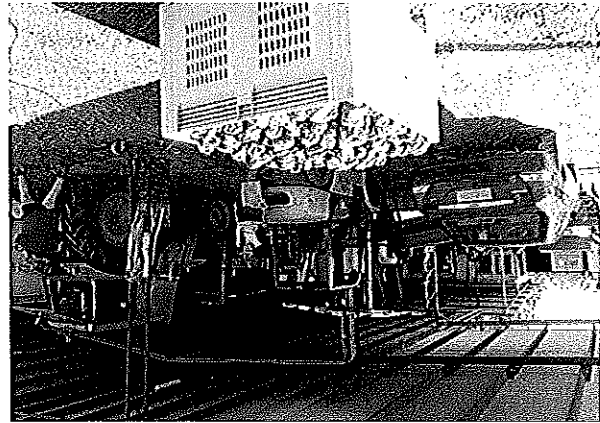
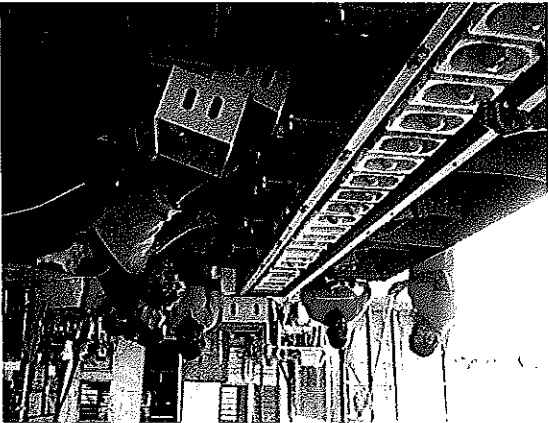
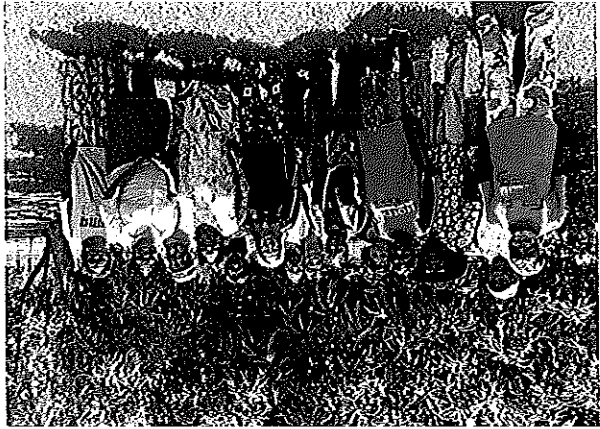
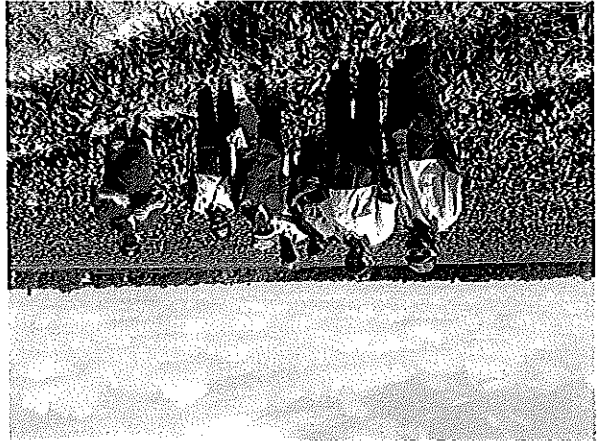
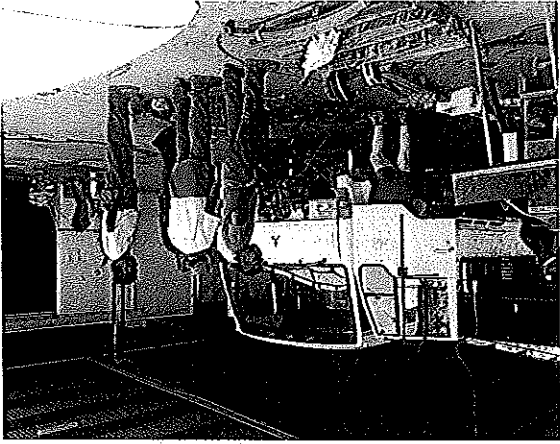


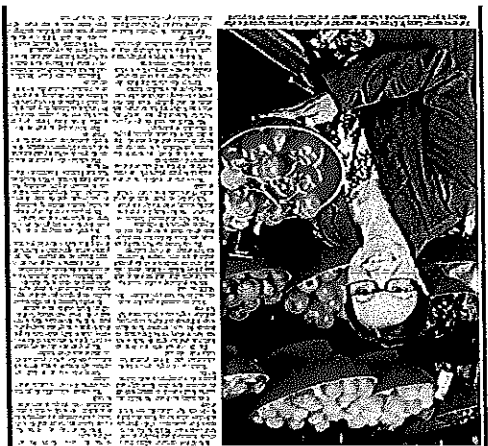
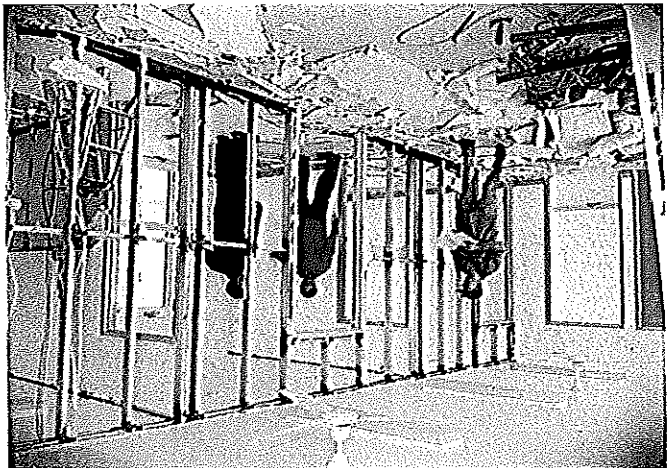
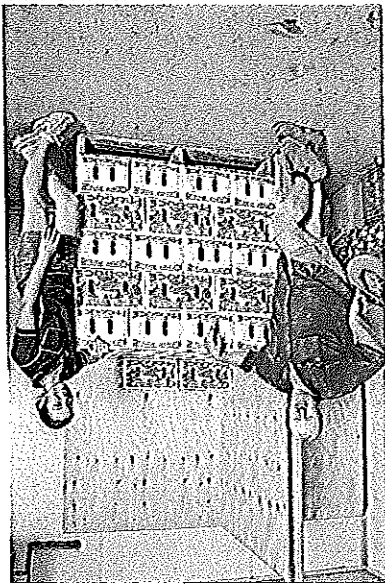
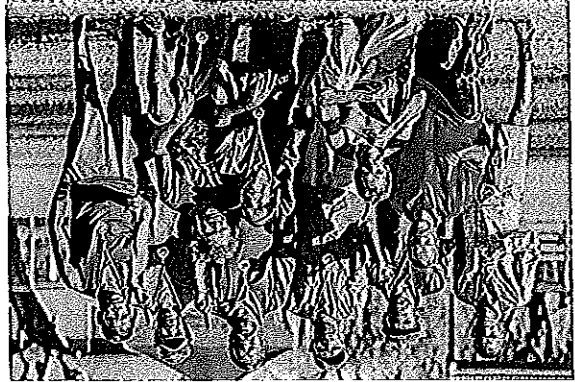
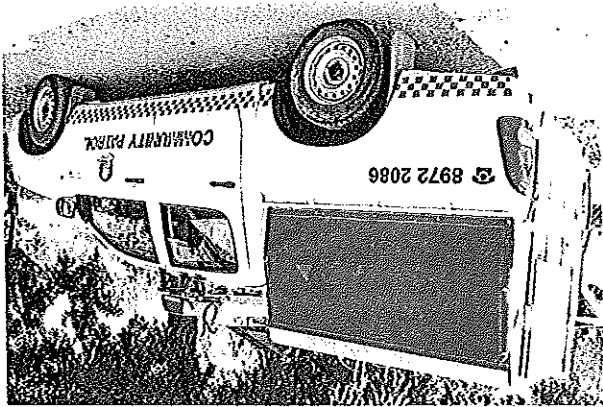

Report on the Financial Report
